Secretary's REPORT OCTOBER 1967.

In this report I shall try to give you a picture of the work I have been doing this past year, and I shall read out the important correspondence.

Letter from David Hutchins B.V. SC.

Letter from Mr. Philip Charley, President R.A.S. Sydney/.

Letter from Lt. Col. C.E.G. Hope, Editor Light Horse and Pony.

The results and story of the 1966 ride were published in Hoofs and Horns, as no doubt most of you have already read. Also, a short description of the ride and some photos appeared in Western Horseman in the July issue. The Arab Horse Society of England published a story in their Arab magazine. This was all favourable publicity, and I think that these papers should be supplied with information and pictures again, to show the world what Australian Endurance Riders are doing.

Letters of thanks were written to all those folk who so generously gave their time to assist in last year's ride. Most of these people are helping again this year too.

During this past year I have offered assistance to 2 other organisations who wrote to the T.Q. 100 Mile Association. Firstly, Mr. and Mrs. Makim from Julia, who were helping to organise a 55 mile ride in their area in April. (Assistance was given as regards) the necessity to have a strict veterinary control, and I sent them copies of some Tevis Cup veterinary charts, also our 1966 T.Q. chart, and the words of advice which David Hutchins gave to us. They used our last years T.Q. organisation as a model for their own. Letter from D.B. Copeman D.V. Of. The results of this ride were published in Hoofs and Horns, and the Cloncurry Ride organisation, hopes

to become an annual event. Secondly, the J.T. McDuff Memorial Ride held out of Brisbane in July. This was a 50 mile ride, and we were able to advise this committee also of the need to get the best Veterinarians available and give them complete control of the actual ride. The Tevis Cup charts and the T.Q. charts were again most useful as a guide and this was a most successful ride. This also is to become an annual event.

You may be interested to learn that an Alpine Riders Association has been formed, with the aim of riding through the Alps during the summer with organised groups. This should have a wide appeal and one day perhaps there may even be an endurance ride conducted in this area. If you are interested Mrs. Serpell is the woman to contact.

Also, my husband and I had a most interesting letter from Wendell Robie, the President of the Western States Trail Ride, who run the Tevis Cup annually. He invited us to ride. Someday it may be possible, ~~but-Australian-ride~~ End it is very pleasant to know that Australian Endurance Riders would be very welcome to compete in one of their rides. ~~By-the-way~~ If any one is considering a trip to see the Tevis Cup, please contact me, and ~~th~~ may be able to arrange a ride.

Membership now stands at 11 associate members and about 30 riding members. It is a little difficult to classify membership, until the new constitution has been adopted. It is time for associate members to renew their membership.

It was necessary to buy 19 buckles at 50 dollars each to cover the cost of the die making. The seven buckles won at last year's ride have been posted to their owners, along with a carved

() leather belt. Mr. Stecher received a replica of the Tom Quilty Gold Cup to keep for himself. If any member has ideas about a better design for a buckle, ~~this-e~~ we would be very pleased to consider it, so that all members will be happy with the buckle. Otherwise we can have more made from the same jeweller, and future buckles may be a little cheaper, because the dies are already paid for. I can look into this. The Gold Cup, by the way contains 38½ ozs. of gold and took 99 hours to make. It is heavier than any Melbourne Cup.

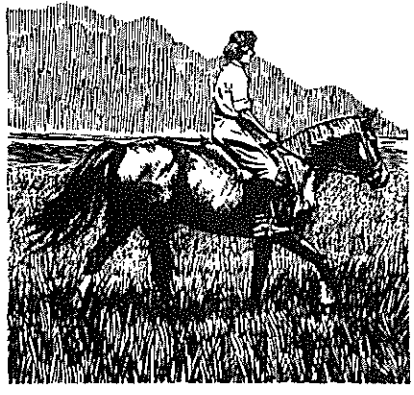

3. Minimum weight to be carried is 160 lbs.. This is to be made up of rider, saddle , bridle and any other gear. Riders to assume responsibility for making up weight.
4. There is a heavy weight division, for all riders who have a total weight of 210 lbs. and over.
5. Whips and spurs not allowed at all.
6. Riders and horses may not have any outside help other than at check points; where their assistants may care for their horses and riders. Fellow riders may assist each other on the route.
7. Riders must complete the ride on the horse nominated at the pre-ride veterinary inspection.
8. Riders may choose any breed of horse; provided it is capable of travelling the distance, and clothes and equipment to suit themselves.
9. It is the responsibility of riders to present themselves and horses at the correct time to leave check points. They will be notified of departure time on a slip of paper on arrival at check points. Riders are advised to synchronise their watches with the chief
